

Minutes of the February 24, 2021

Meeting of the Board of Directors

**Present (via Zoom or Telephone):** Carolyn Bennett, Ronnie Blendell, Christine Doran, Debbie Gall, Barbara Hogan, Carol Jonas, Lynne Lenhardt, Lynn Millspaugh, Kathy Schimanski, Pam Tindall-O'Brien, Karen Winters

Absent: Rosemary Brown, Joyce Demoly, Phyllis Drew

The meeting was called to order by president Lynne Lenhardt at 10:06am.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

- 1. **Approval of the Minutes:** Christine Doran moved to approve the minutes of the November 13, 2020 Board of Directors meeting, with the date of the meeting corrected to read November 13, 2020. Carol Jonas seconded. The motion passed.
- 2. **Treasurer's Report:** Christine Doran reported that, given our unusual year with limited club activities, we are not spending in the usual ways. We are currently \$3500 under budget overall, with a checking account balance of approximately \$14,000 due to a roll-over of funds from the previous year. Other discussion of note:
  - a. Zoom subscription was changed to an annual membership for \$112.
  - b. Fee for the post office box is included in the postage line which will likely go over budget since we are publishing the Progress In Print monthly.
  - c. C-Lynk Karen Winters moved and Ronnie Blendell seconded to donate the \$138 received from the redemption of bottles and cans to the Bethlehem town heating fund. (Christine Doran will talk to Joan Gavrilik about going paperless)
  - d. There was a discussion about the purpose and renewal dates for certificates of deposit. Christine Doran received some guidance from other board members and will contact the previous Treasurer for additional clarification. (cont'd.)

(February 24 2021 Board of Directors' Meeting Minutes, cont'd.)

e. It was decided that when we are able to meet in person again, and as we resume the practice of passing a can for cash donations to the town heating fund, those donations will be counted by two members, and given to the Treasurer for disbursement.

Pam Tindall-O'Brien moved to accept the Treasurer's Report as amended. The motion was seconded by Debbie Gall and approved.

**3. Study Group Updates:** Lynne Lenhardt reported that the Literature Group is planning a hybrid model for meeting in the future. Inperson gatherings will resume when it is safe and Zoom meetings will be used until then and whenever the weather dictates.

#### 4. Committee Updates:

- a. There was an extensive discussion about the composition of the Nominating Committee and whether membership of the committee is dictated by the By-Laws or by past practice. Having newer members on the Nominating Committee could result in expanding the pool of members for consideration of leadership positions in the club. Additionally, Barbara Hogan expressed interest in continuing to serve as the club's Recording Secretary. She has been appointed by the president to do so.
- 5. Monday Morning Musings: Pam Tindall-O'Brien presented a proposal to invite the Woman's Club of Albany to join us for a Zoom presentation by Paul Grondahl about the Albany Rural Cemetery. Three Study Groups (Health and Fitness, Environment, Conservation and Garden, and Antiques) are collaborating on this event. Mr. Grondahl will speak via Zoom on Monday, April 17 and the members will be invited to tour the cemetery the following Monday. There was some discussion about the WCA having once been a member of the GFWC; Carolyn Bennett stated that some DPC members may not support this invitation. Pam Tindall-O'Brien moved to invite the WCA to the April 17 Monday Morning Musings event. Carolyn Bennett seconded and the motion passed. (It is not necessary for Board approval to offer Mr. Grondahl a \$100 stipend, which will be paid from the Health and Fitness Study Group.)

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- 1. Futures Committee: Lynne Lenhardt reported that she will use the upcoming MMM to discuss this new committee, the DPC Mission Statement and a member survey.
- 2. GFWC Updates:
  - a. Pancreatic Cancer has been established as an initiative of the NYS GFWC.
  - b. Delmar Progress Club is celebrating its 120th anniversary this year.
  - c. There are state and national competitions for newsletters that we might want to enter
  - d. State Honor Roll Lynne Lenhardt appointed a committee in January. The committee will select two members to be named to the Honor Roll since no one was chosen last year. The club contributes \$25 each to GFWC-NY for the honor roll.

Christine Doran stated that the club is doing a fabulous job under difficult circumstances. The DPC has been a lifeline for her and many of us. Debbie Gall mentioned that she appreciates what everyone is doing for the club and our members. Pam Tindall-O'Brien and Lynne Lenhardt added that the "parties" we've had on Zoom have helped us get to know each other better. It was agreed that we will follow the guidance of science, the CDC and the government recommendations for determining when it is safe to meet in person again.

Pam Tindall-O'Brien moved and Kathy Schimanski seconded that the meeting adjourn at 11:30am. The motion carried.
