As we approach the end of another pandemic year, I feel that it's more im-





Lynne Lenhardt called the meeting to order at 10:09, welcomed everyone and thanked Lynn Millspaugh for volunteering to take the minutes.

Debbie Gall moved to accept the May 13 minutes with Kathy Schimanski seconding. The motion passed accepting the minutes as written.

Christine Doran gave a lengthy treasurer's report. The scholarships spent \$119 more than was taken in. The Unrestricted Fund for 2020-2021 spent \$319 .65 over budget. The September dinner had a surplus of approximately \$160 which will go to the Emergency Relief Fund. Chris is moving the Berkshire account to Key Bank for better interest but not for a CD. In 2020-21, monies were distributed from Arts and Antiques, Environment, Conservation and Garden, and Health and Wellness to cover donations for Paul Grondahl's presentation and the tour of the Albany Rural Cemetery. Performing Arts spent money on the suffragette's play. Chris said she will shred checks which are 6-7 years old. The treasurer's report was accepted for audit.

Karen Winters announced that the club has 130 paid members and 10 life members. She then explained the reasoning behind the next two motions. Karen moved with Phyllis Drew seconding, to drop from membership Barbara Knapp, Nan Rabinow and Norene White. Motion carried. Karen moved with Kathy Newkirk seconding to name Joyce Demoly and Audrey Watson Inactive Members. Motion carried.

Study Group Updates: Travel Group may meet in person or by Zoom for a talk about Scotland and Southeast Asia. The Wellness and Natural World group walked at Peebles Island and will be touring Olde Delmar on November 22.

Committee Updates: Bylaws Committee needs a new chairperson. Debbie Gall updated the group on the transfer of materials to the Archive Unit at UAlbany and on some materials that weren't appropriate for the Archives. The Scholarship Committee will make its annual appeal for funds in January.
