#### June 28, 2022 Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

Present: Pamela Tindall-O'Brien, Debbie Gall, Barbara Kavanagh, Margaret Dilgen, Christine Doran, Carolynn Bennett, Joan Gavrilik, Kathleen Newkirk, Barbara Hogan, Maryalice Svare

Absent: Phyllis Drew, Lynne Lenhardt, Rosemary Brown

Pamela Tindall-O'Brien called the meeting to order at 1:06, and welcomed everyone.

Pam has examined the club's bylaws and Certificate of Incorporation; Delmar Progress Club is a 501(c)3 entity, and we can raise funds up to \$25,000 to support our goals and to donate. Above that amount, we would have to register as a fund-raising organization. Chris Doran researched this issue last November after questions from Keybank, which may ask for a report on our financial activities.

There was a discussion of the role of the Board and how much control/oversight it should exercise over the committees of the Club. Joan advocated more oversight, while Maryalice pointed out that the trust level was important, and not wanting to overburden committee chairs. Some committees are running well, others struggle with members and finding women willing to take on leadership roles. Pam proposed having a program group meet to help committees develop schedules, in order to avoid scheduling conflicts. The committee chairs would pre-plan and propose programs to bring to the meeting. In general, the Board favored a more macro approach to oversight of the committees. Debbie spoke in favor of a general meeting for committee chairs.

Several Bylaws changes were suggested, including changing the duties of the Corresponding Secretary to include sending Remembrances and Condolences, and eliminating the Remembrance committee. There was also the suggestion to change the date when dues are to be paid, to a date prior to the yearbook printing.

The Board all agreed that increasing membership and participation by members was a vital issue. We should increase our outreach, and refine our club's message of charitable and community service, self-improvement, and civic engagement. Members liked the motto "Service to Community, Self-improvement, and Social and Civic Engagement."

Current paid membership is 77. There are eleven Life Members; we do not pay \$20 dues to GFWC for Life Members. Carolyn moved, Barb Kavanagh seconded a motion to continue to offer Life Memberships to 45-year Members. This motion passed, and the Board voted unanimously to extend Life Membership to Marty McSharry.

Debbie reported on her plans as Membership Chair. She plans to call each member of the club, and survey their current interests and plans for involvement in Progress Club. She is reaching out to the members of the Bethlehem Businesswomen's Club, as that group is dissolving. Debbie is working on our Membership tri-fold, which is available at the Library.

Joan shared the timeline for the Yearbook, which will be available in print AND online versions. The deadline for edits is August 1, and the goal is to have the Yearbook to the printer on August 7. Joan will post the club's "job openings" with goals and objectives in the next PIP.

There was some interest in changing the Scrapbook position to that of Historian/Archivist to more correctly describe the duties of that person. Debbie will get guidance from Jody Boyle at SUNY Albany as to what materials are most relevant to add to our archive.

Pam Tindall-O'Brien told the group about MEETUP, which is a community group for people with diverse interests. She said that this might be a way to reach women who have not heard of our group. Pam suggested that we explore joining. Barbara Hogan will research information about costs, etc. and present options at the next meeting of the Board.

Kathy Newkirk has contacted Yankee Trails about daytrips, and there was discussion about pairing with other groups to ensure a "full bus".

The meeting was adjourned at 3:06.
