



Delmar Progress Club — January 8, 2024 General Meeting Minutes

Pamela Tindall-O'Brien called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. and welcomed everyone. She led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes from the November meeting were distributed. Lynn Rhodes moved to accept the minutes, Sue DiMura seconded, and the minutes were accepted.

Barbara Kavanagh talked briefly about the Holiday Tea; there was a short discussion about moving the event earlier in the afternoon.

Katie Suhr presented information about a volunteer project with which she is involved. She is an Ambassador for ENGin, which pairs English speakers with Ukrainians aged 9-35 for online conversation practice and cross-cultural connection. She distributed information about the program, and encouraged members to get involved.

The Albany Women's Club is holding a fundraiser on February 10, 2024 at 7 p.m. They are presenting a performance of the play "Love Letters". Funds raised will go to teens at the Albany County Crime Victim Center.

Information was distributed about a potential dues increase. Chris Doran prepared an overview of the Club's increasing expenses, and how the current dues, which have not been raised since 2015, are no longer adequate for our expenses. This issue will be presented to the DPC Board at its next meeting.

Members were asked to send cards to Josie Woods, who has had some health issues recently.

Bethlehem Town Supervisor David Van Leuven spoke to the group ahead of his "State of the Town" address. We got updates on the Heath Farm Project, new and improved accessibility at Town facilities, our compost facility (which is a model for NYS!), and incentives for Historic Preservation and Protection.

Denise Gisotti encouraged members to come and sew hospital gowns for children receiving surgery through Operation Smile. The sewing session will be held at the Bethlehem Library on Monday, January 22, 2024 from 9 a.m. until noon.

The Scholarship Ctte raised \$910 dollars at the Holiday Tea, and an additional \$80 at the meeting today.

Lynne Lenhardt told the group about an award through GFWC designed to recognize the volunteer activities of middle and high school students. The GFWC New York Youth Community Service Award emphasizes projects that address the needs of a particular local organization or a community need. Each year, GFWC New York will select a club or individual who will receive recognition for an outstanding project, and a donation will be made to the organization benefitting from the project. The deadline for the contest is March 1.

The nominating ctte needs members to fill several crucial positions for the next two years. Still needed: President, First VP, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer. Please contact Lynne Lenhardt if you are willing to serve.


Please report your volunteer hours for 2023 to Pam ASAP. She is preparing the report for NYS and national GFWC.
