

Kathy Raffe introduced our speakers, Jolie and Michael Hicks, who gave a very moving presentation about the need for confidential mental health services for veterans and active-duty military members. They started their organization, Hickstrong, Inc, after their son McCoy's death. The American Legions in Hudson Falls and Clifton Park are sponsoring "HugaMug" events to raise funds.

Minutes from the February meeting were distributed. Denise Gisotti moved to accept them, Joan Gavrilik seconded, and the minutes were accepted.

There was a discussion about the need to raise Club dues from \$45 to \$50 per year. Barbara Kavanagh moved to raise the dues, Phyllis Drew seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Rosemary Brown joined the Delmar Progress Club and GFWC in 1979. She served on multiple committees, including Community Service, the Emergency Relief Fund, the Finance, Creative Arts and Nominating committees. From 2004-2006, she served as DPC Club President. Subsequently, she volunteered to serve on the GFWCNY Board and was voted State President in 2014. Her president's special project was breast cancer awareness.



Rosemary strongly believed that teaching and learning were important to everyone throughout their lives, but her greatest joy was her family. She enjoyed her morning crossword puzzles and reading. She also loved gardening, travel, and serving the community as well as spending time with friends and family.

Music was an important part of her life. She was an ardent supporter of the New York State Symphony Orchestra, volunteering at many levels. She later became the GFWCNY Music Chairman, a position at which she thrived. Together with husband, Neil, they would share their love of music at many of the GFWCNY state conventions.

She was an avid knitter, always making blankets and lap robes for patients at the VA Hospital. She had fondness for cameo jewelry, and her husband Neil was always looking for a reason to add yet another pin to her collection. She had sparkling blue eyes and a sweet smile. She was an amazing woman that truly lived the "volunteer spirit"!




