- 1<sup>st</sup> Place Membership for recruiting nine new members and changing meeting format by inviting friends to club meetings with specific presentations





#### **COMMUNITY SERVICE COMMITTEE REPORT 2023-2024**

The focus of the service projects for the 2023-2024 year: "MINDful for Mental Health"



In October, we prepared a yummy meal for about 30 of Bethlehem's Senior Citizens at their monthly luncheon. Our members stepped up to make the meal from scratch and handcrafted an individual party bag for each person to bring home and enjoy later. The guests were very well fed and went home feeling pleased. This luncheon also fulfilled our National Day of Service that we participated in with the GFWC.

At our March meeting we heard a presentation by the Hicks Family Foundation about military suicide. They lost their son who was in the Navy to suicide when he had a placement which was not a good fit for him. Within the branches of the service, there is a lack of counseling support and a pervasive attitude that prevents active and veteran military from seeking mental health counseling. The HicksStrong foundation raises money to provide funding for counseling for people in the military and matches them up with telehealth counselors, no matter where they are stationed. They do Hug Mug community events to help raise these funds....our club generously donated \$352 in a passed mug to help support this cause.

We collected an amazing amount of jewelry for our May initiative! We were able to package up 41 bags of jewelry that were delivered to the South End Children's Cafe for the children to choose and give to their Mothers for Mother's Day. Just think of the smiles that we were able to provide for both the children and their Mothers that day!

We have continued to collect flip tabs for the Ronald McDonald House, delivering almost 3.0 pounds! That is a lot of tabs!
